## BPS SETS NEW CANDIDATE AND SITE RECORDS IN 2007

(Washington, DC) -- The Board of Pharmaceutical Specialties (BPS), an organization whose purpose is to recognize pharmacy specialties and certify pharmacists' knowledge and skills, will administer its written specialty certification and re-certification examinations to a total of over 1600 candidates at 41 sites world-wide on the first weekend in October 2007. These numbers set new records for the largest number of candidates and exam sites in the 31-year history of BPS. Over 300 additional candidates are expected to re-certify using approved continuing education programs prior to the end of 2007.

Major contributors to the record numbers were increases of nearly 68% in the number of pharmacists applying to take the Pharmacotherapy specialty examination and 37% for the Oncology Pharmacy examination over the previous high registrations in 2006. "These increases are highly significant," reported Jannet M. Carmichael, PharmD, BCPS, and BPS Chairman. "The numbers suggest that BPS specialty certification is becoming widely recognized and valued as a credential for specialty-level pharmacy clinicians."

The 2007 BPS examinations will be administered at 31 sites across the United States (including sites in Alaska and Hawaii) as well as ten foreign locations, including Al Ain, United Arab Emirates; Beirut, Lebanon; Cairo, Egypt; Madrid, Spain; Sherbrooke (Quebec), Canada; Seoul, South Korea; Singapore; and three sites in Saudi Arabia. Another record high number of 90 candidates have applied to take BPS exams in these foreign locations. This is the fifth consecutive year that large groups of more than 20 pharmacists will be sitting for the BPS examinations in Madrid and the second year for a similar group in Seoul. "This expansion of our foreign exams indicates the growing recognition of BPS specialty certification worldwide," notes Richard J. Bertin, PhD, BPS Executive Director. "BPS has been providing additional local test sites in foreign and domestic locations for several years with the goal of making the specialty certification process accessible to more pharmacist specialists."

The **Board of Pharmaceutical Specialties (BPS)** was founded by the American Pharmaceutical Association (now the American Pharmacists Association; APhA) in January 1976 to recognize specialties and certify pharmacists in specialized areas of pharmacy practice. Five specialties are currently recognized by BPS: 1) nuclear pharmacy, since 1978; 2) nutrition support pharmacy, since 1988; 3) pharmacotherapy, since 1988; 4) psychiatric pharmacy, since 1992; and 5) oncology pharmacy, since 1996. Currently, there are nearly 6,000 pharmacist specialists certified by BPS.
