## **BPS SETS NEW CANDIDATE AND SITE RECORDS IN 2010**

(Washington, DC) -- The Board of Pharmacy Specialties (BPS), an organization whose purpose is to recognize pharmacy specialties and certify pharmacists' knowledge and skills, will administer its written specialty certification and re-certification examinations to a total of approximately 2,700 candidates at 58 sites world-wide on the first weekend in October 2010. These numbers once again set new records for the largest numbers of candidates and exam sites in the 34-year history of BPS. Over 300 additional candidates are expected to re-certify using approved continuing education programs prior to the end of 2010.

The number of new examination candidates was up approximately 15% over the previous high registrations in 2009. "These increases are very significant," reported Rebecca R. Finley, PharmD, and BPS Chair. "The numbers suggest that BPS specialty certification is becoming widely recognized and valued as a credential for specialty-level pharmacy clinicians."

The 2010 BPS examinations will be administered at 41 sites across the United States (including sites in Alaska and Hawaii) as well as 17 foreign locations, including Al Ain, United Arab Emirates; Bangkok, Thailand; Collingwood (Victoria), Australia; Cairo and Nasr City, Egypt; Madrid, Spain; Montreal (Quebec) Canada; Riyadh and Jeddah, Saudi Arabia; Seoul, South Korea; Singapore; Toronto (Ontario) Canada; and DANTES military sites in Germany, Guam, Iraq, and Qatar .

Another record high number of 278 candidates have applied to take BPS exams outside the United States. This is nearly a 22% increase over 2009. “The expansion of our foreign exams indicates the growing recognition of BPS specialty certification worldwide,” notes Richard J. Bertin, PhD, BPS Executive Director. “BPS has significantly increased its numbers of exam locations for several years with the goal of making the specialty certification process accessible to more pharmacist specialists.”

The **Board of Pharmacy Specialties (BPS)** is an autonomous Division of the American Pharmacists Association (APhA), founded in January 1976 to recognize specialties and certify pharmacists in specialized areas of pharmacy practice. Six specialties are currently recognized by BPS: 1) nuclear pharmacy, since 1978; 2) nutrition support pharmacy, since 1988; 3) pharmacotherapy, since 1988; 4) psychiatric pharmacy, since 1992; and 5) oncology pharmacy, since 1996. The latest BPS specialty, focused on ambulatory care pharmacy, was approved in June 2009, and is scheduled for its first examination in 2011. More than 9,000 pharmacist specialists are currently certified by BPS.
